

Weaver's Knot


When you run out of thread you can connect a new thread with the Weaver's Knot. This knot is a slip knot formed by two loops.

- 1. Take one end of the new thread and put the long end over the short end.
- 2. Put the long end under the loop. Grab through the loop and pull up the long end lying under the loop.




3. Hold the two ends of the thread with one hand and pull the thread from underneath with the other hand up. Make the loop tight.






4. Place the loop over the short end of the thread in the text block and pull the two ends until it clicks. You can feel and sometimes even here the click. If you don't feel or hear it, the connection won't hold. So just try again until you get that click!



5. After the click the two threads are connected firmly and you can cut off the two short ends of the thread and continue sewing.
